

Four WVU Medicine hospitals recognized as High Performing by U.S. News & World Report

J.W. Ruby Memorial Hospital achieves sixth consecutive ranking as top hospital in West Virginia, has three High Performing specialties

distinction a hospital can earn for U.S. News' Best Hospitals Procedures and Conditions ratings.

<u>WVU Medicine J.W. Ruby Memorial Hospital</u>, which received its sixth-consecutive ranking as the top hospital in West Virginia, was also named High Performing in three specialties: <u>Gastroenterology and GI Surgery</u>; <u>Orthopedics</u>; and <u>Urology</u>.

The annual Procedures and Conditions ratings are designed to assist patients and their healthcare providers in making informed decisions about where to receive care for challenging health conditions or elective procedures.

U.S. News evaluated nearly 4,400 hospitals across 15 adult specialties and 22 procedures and conditions. Hospitals awarded a "Best" designation excelled at factors such as clinical outcomes, level of nursing care and patient experience.

"For more than three decades, *U.S. News* has been an invaluable guide for patients," said Managing Editor and Chief of Health Analysis Ben Harder at *U.S. News*. "Hospitals designated as 'High Performing' by *U.S. News* demonstrate a consistent ability to provide excellent care for particular medical procedures and conditions, showcasing their specialized expertise as well as dedication to exceptional patient outcomes."

To determine the <u>Best Hospitals</u>, *U.S. News* evaluated each hospital's performance on objective measures such as risk-adjusted mortality rates, preventable complications, and level of nursing care.

The Best Hospitals Specialty rankings <u>methodology</u> and Procedures and Conditions ratings <u>methodology</u> measure patient outcomes using data from over 800 million records of patient care.
