

WVU Medicine Berkeley Medical Center announces pharmacy relocation

MARTINSBURG – WVU Medicine Berkeley Medical Center announced the planned relocation of its retail pharmacy to Medical Office Building 1, located at 2010 Doctor Oates Drive. The move is designed to enhance pharmacy patient access and convenience. In its new location on campus, the pharmacy will be called, Community Pharmacy.

To complete the transition, the retail pharmacy was closed for three days. The pharmacy reopened April 27 at its new location.

Patients will continue to receive the same trusted services from existing pharmacy staff, with improved accessibility in the new space.

“Relocating just outside the hospital gives us the opportunity to offer patients improved access and a more comfortable environment, without changing the care they rely on,” said Samantha Richards, chief operations officer and chief nursing officer, WVU Medicine Berkeley Medical Center. “We’re proud to continue serving our community with the same pharmacy team and dedication to quality.”

Transforming care: Patient tower project

The relocation supports the hospital’s broader patient tower project, a transformative \$200 million investment focused on expanding and modernizing patient care spaces across the WVU Medicine Berkeley Medical Center campus. Moving the pharmacy outside the main hospital aligns pharmacy services with future patient flow and access improvements planned as part of the project.

Project highlights include:

Increased inpatient capacity through the elimination of all semi-private rooms.

Replacement of the linear accelerator at the WVU Cancer Institute to support advanced cancer care.

Expanded facilities designed to meet the community's growing health care needs.

The new patient tower is expected to open in early 2028.
